WORD CLASS	DEFINITION	EXAMPLES
<b>Noun</b>	Name of an object, place or person.	Hardenhuish, apple, John etc.
<b>Pronoun</b>	Replaces a noun.	I, he, we, they etc.
<b>Concrete Noun</b>	Names of things you can physically see/touch.	Table, mud, shoe etc.
<b>Abstract Noun</b>	Names of things you can't physically see/touch.	Love, anger, hunger etc.
<b>Adjective</b>	Describes a noun.	Purple, beautiful, happy etc.
<b>Comparative Adjective</b>	Compares differences between two nouns.	Stronger, smarter, angrier etc.
<b>Superlative Adjective</b>	Describes nouns as the most they can be.	Happiest, best, fastest etc.
<b>Verb</b>	A doing word or action.	Jump, think, sing etc.
<b>Auxiliary Verb</b>	Used to form the tense of other verbs.	Is, was, does, has etc.
<b>Modal Verb</b>	Indicates the certainty of the action.	Can, could, may, might, must, ought to, shall, should, will, would
<b>Adverb</b>	Describes how an action is completed.	Quickly, slowly, irritatingly etc.
<b>Conjunction</b>	Connectives that join ideas or sentences.	And, but, if etc.
<b>Preposition</b>	Indicates physical or time location.	After, besides, in etc.
<b>Determiner</b>	Used before a noun to show which particular example of the noun you are referring to.	That, the, a, every etc.
<b>Intensifier</b>	Used to increase strength or emphasise meaning.	Too, very, totally etc.
